St. Paul U.M. Church Mission Statement:

To share Christ's love through Worship, Ministry, Mission and Fellowship Dear St. Paul Friends,
Please join with me as we enter a special season of focused prayer through this post-Easter season. I always try to remember that wherever I go as a Pastor and wherever we go as a church, Jesus walks ahead of us. Whether we are uncertain, confused, anxious; no matter (and at St. Paul we have reason for all of these feelings) — Jesus walks ahead to calm our fears. To give us assurance, the Apostle Paul wrote in II Corinthians 5:7, that the Christian "Walks by faith and not by sight." With that truth spoken, we follow Jesus into the future, unafraid, for "we walk by faith."

The journey of Jesus and the Disciples to Jerusalem began up north, about as far north as you can go in modern day Israel. Matthew 16 tells us that Jesus told his Disciples that he must go to Jerusalem for the Passover celebration, and that he would suffer many things and be killed, and then rise on the third day." The Disciples protested. If you know what is going to happen, why on earth would you go? But we are told, "He set his face to go to Jerusalem." Mark 10 then says, "They were on their way up to Jerusalem, with Jesus leading the way, and the disciples were astonished..." Take comfort, my friends at St. Paul. There goes Jesus out ahead of us and He will make a way. In fact, Doug Moen, has written a song that speaks to these uncertainties. Here are the lyrics:

God will make a way, where there seems to be no way;
He works in ways we cannot see, He will make a way for me.
He will be my guide, hold me closely to His side;
With love and strength for each new day, He will make a way.
By a roadway in the wilderness, He'll lead me;
And rivers in the desert will I see.
Heaven and Earth will fade but His Word will still remain,
And He will do something new today.
(Repeat the chorus)

This song has powerful origins. Here is the story behind the song as Moen tells it:

"I got a call from my mother-in-law late one night, and she told me that my wife's sister and her husband, Craig and Susan Phelps, had been involved in a tragic car accident while taking their kids on a ski trip," Don Moen recounted. "All four of their children were thrown out of the vehicle, and the oldest, a 9-year-old boy, was killed instantly. The other three were seriously injured."

"It was life-altering; I didn't know what to say to them," he continued. "Craig was a Bible teacher at his church, and they were both full of faith. As I sat on the plane, wondering what I should say to them, I began to read in the book of Isaiah, and chapter 43, verse 19 stood out to me: 'I will even make a way in the wilderness, and rivers in the desert.' Instantly, the Lord gave me a song to sing to them."

Privately, Moen performed the song for his grieving in-laws, which includes the poignant lyrics, "Oh, God will make a way/Where there seems to be no way/He works in ways we cannot see/He will make a way for me."

"It was a song written in desperation, but it brought a word of hope to them. When everything around you seems lost, God is working in ways you cannot see."

In this season of our history, let us pray for the way that God will make, even though we cannot see it. Jesus goes ahead of us. Take comfort. Pray for the leadership of our congregation that we may be steadfast in our commitment to the mission. Pray for the staff of our congregation that they will follow Jesus as he makes a way by walking ahead of us. Yes, let us covenant to make this a season of prayer. Amen.

FEBRUARY 2024 food distribution statistics

We were open 19 days in February. We provided supplemental groceries and personal care items to 208 people in 75 households. We assisted 103 adults, 57 seniors and 48 youth. New households served was 5 with 10 new individuals, including 1 youth, 5 adults, and 4 seniors. (FYI: Senior = 60 yrs +; Adult = 18-59 yrs; Youth = 0-17 yrs.)


